### **Advising Freshmen Honors Scholars**

All First-year Honors scholars will continue in the Honors program as long as they have maintained the minimum GPA of 3.4 and complete curricular requirements. Those who have lower grade point averages may either be on probation or no longer in the Honors program. If you are uncertain about the status of your advisee, give me a call.

In Spring all honors freshmen need to enroll in one section of an Honors Seminars (IN200 through IN207). They also need to enroll in an Honors Section of IN151, Critical Writing, Reading and Research II.

### **Advising Sophomore Honors Scholars**

All second year Honors Scholars will continue in the Honors program as long as they have maintained the minimum GPA of 3.4 and complete curricular requirements. Those who have lower grade point averages may either be on probation or no longer in the Honors program. If you are uncertain about the status of your advisee, give me a call.

All of the current Sophomores need to have completed a total of three sections of Honors Seminar (IN200 – IN207) by the end of their sophomore year. Each section taken must have a different number (i.e. be in a different subject area). If following the typical track, they should enroll in one section of an Honors Seminar over three semesters.

### **Important Difference in Programs**

Please recall that Honors Scholars follow the Honor Program curriculum requirements and not the regular MPSL sequential and non-sequential courses..

They **do not have:**

- a fine arts requirement
- IN250/IN251 US Studies requirements
- an oral communication requirement
- a lab science requirement
- a quantitative reasoning requirement
- International/cultures-systems requirements (though BA degrees have a language competency requirement – through 223 level)

They do, however, have to meet the school/division distribution requirements for their respective schools, and they do have to meet any additional requirements set for particular degrees (for example BA Degrees must have modern language competency).

Note: Students who leave or are removed from the Honors Program and even honors students who do not go on to become JMS students must complete all regular MPSL sequential and non-sequential requirements.

### **Advising Junior James Millikin Scholars (JMS)**

All Junior JMS students will continue in the Honors program as long as they have maintained the minimum GPA of 3.5. Those who have lower grade point averages may either be on probation or no longer in the Honors program. If you are uncertain about the status of your advisee, give me a call.

All must register for one or two credits of IN491 (Honors Independent Project) unless the student is taking the equivalent research credits in Biology or Chemistry (391/392). The number of IN491 credits (or the equivalent) must total 6 by the end of the senior year.

All must register for the one-credit IN492 (Honors Seminar) unless the student will be abroad, will be on the Washington semester, or will be student teaching. Three sections are available.

### **Advising Senior James Millikin Scholars (JMS)**

All Senior JMS students will continue in the Honors program as long as they have maintained the minimum GPA of 3.5. Those who have lower grade point averages may either be on probation or no longer in the Honors program. If you are uncertain about the status of your advisee, give me a call.

All must register for one or two credits of IN491 (Honors Independent Project) unless the student is taking the equivalent research credits in Biology or Chemistry (391/392). The number of IN491 credits (or the equivalent) must total 6 by the end of the senior year.

All must register for the one-credit IN492 (Honors Seminar) unless the student will be abroad, will be on the Washington semester, or will be student teaching. Three sections are available.

### **Important Difference in Programs**

Please recall that James Millikin Scholars follow the JMS Program requirements and not the regular MPSL (though they DO take an IN350).

They **do not have**:

- a fine arts requirement
- IN250/IN251 US Studies requirements
