## Millikin University School of Music Minor in Music

A minor in music is available to students majoring in any of the University's colleges or schools. Acceptance as a music minor is subject to a successful audition in an applied music area taught by the Millikin University School of Music faculty and the approval of the Director of the School of Music.

Only four credits of applied music and major ensemble participation are required for the music minor. However, to retain a music talent award, a student must participate in a major ensemble every semester. Nine credits must be in music courses numbered 300 or above. Note that applied lessons and ensembles in year three and four are upper-level courses.

†Major ensemble is defined as Concert Band or Wind Ensemble for instrumentalists, Millikin/Decatur Symphony Orchestra for string players, and a traditional choir for singers. Guitar Ensemble I & II also count as a major ensemble. Keyboard principals may replace major organization with MU 360, Keyboard Accompanying and Ensemble, in semesters 3-4. They may elect to do so in semesters 5-8 as well.
